Cal/OSHA Encourages Criminal Case in Milpitas Fatality

The California Department of Industrial Relations' Division of Occupational Safety and Health, known as Cal/OSHA, issued 14 citations totaling \$168,175 to a Fremont, Calif.-based construction and investment company, US-Sino Investments, Inc., and called for additional action in connection with the death of Raul Zapata, 37, a carpenter who died when an excavation wall at a Milpitas home construction site fell on him Jan. 28, 2012. The city of Milpitas had issued a stop work order at that site three days earlier, Cal/OSHA Chief...
